What is this product?

TYPE OF PRODUCT

The product is a sub-fund of Hereford Funds, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

TERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the board of directors may decide to close this product under certain circumstances.

OBJECTIVES

Objectives and investment policy

The investment objective of the Sub-Fund is to provide long term capital growth, measured in USD, primarily through investment in equities and equity-linked securities of Indian companies or companies deriving a significant portion of their business from India.

Investment exposure will be achieved through equities and equity-linked securities (such as listed shares, ADRs (American Depositary Receipt) and GDRs (Global Depositary Receipt)). Investors should refer to the "Risk Warning" section for special risk considerations applicable to the Sub-Fund.

The primary objective of the strategy adopted by the Sub-Fund is to run a concentrated portfolio, consisting of the team's high conviction investment ideas. The strategy will be market cap agnostic and there will not be any restriction on the sectors in which it can invest.

The investment philosophy is centred around buying growing businesses, with above average return on capital economics, backed by managements with a track record of good governance and valued at a reasonable risk/reward ratio.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Sub-Fund will not invest more than 10% of its net asset in UCITS and other UCIs.

The Sub-Fund may use futures and options on securities, indices and interest rates for different purposes (i.e. hedging and efficient portfolio management).

Benchmark The Sub-Fund shall be actively managed. The Sub-Fund shall use MSCI India Investable Market Index (IMI) as its benchmark purely for comparison purposes. The Investment Manager is not in any way constrained by the benchmark index in its portfolio positioning. This implies that the Investment Manager is taking investment decisions without reference to the benchmark index and the Sub-Fund can deviate significantly from the index.

ESG information The Investment Manager will integrate sustainability and ESG (Environmental, Social, Governance) risks in its investment decision making process (the "ESG Integration"). The material ESG risk factors are analysed alongside traditional financial factors and are considered in forming investment decisions. This approach would be sector specific and would incorporate only the most material ESG risk factors into the ESG assessment of a sector / company. The Sub-Fund does not promote environmental or social characteristics within the meaning of SFDR (article 8) nor is it classified as a pursuing a sustainable investment objective (article 9). The investments underlying the Sub-Fund do not take into account the EU criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities.

Dividend Policy This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

Share Class Currency The currency of the Class is USD.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. (the "Administrative Agent"). This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTOR

The product is reserved for institutional investors. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

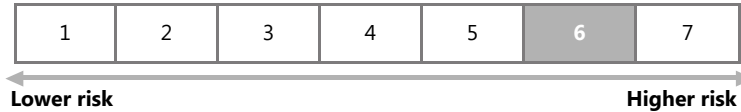

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator

What happens if HF Arode Asset Management S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to the Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depositary, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depositary.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.
